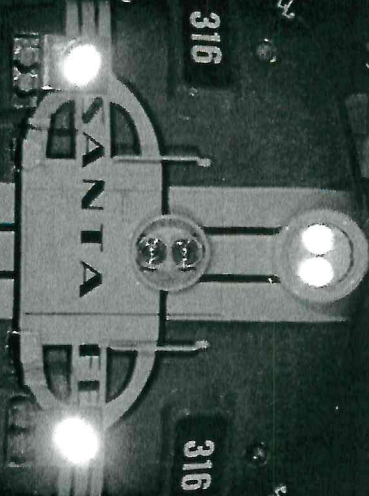

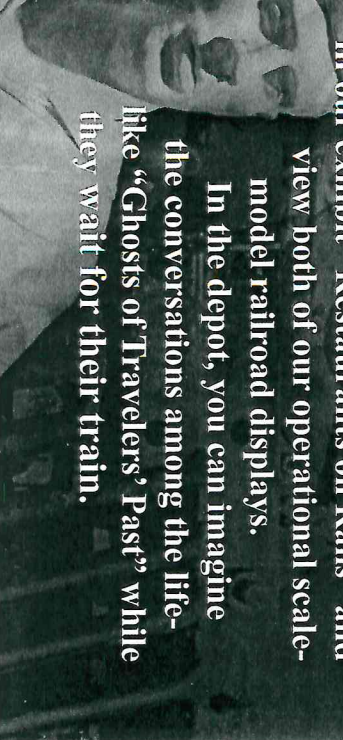


Home of the Santa Fe Warbonnets

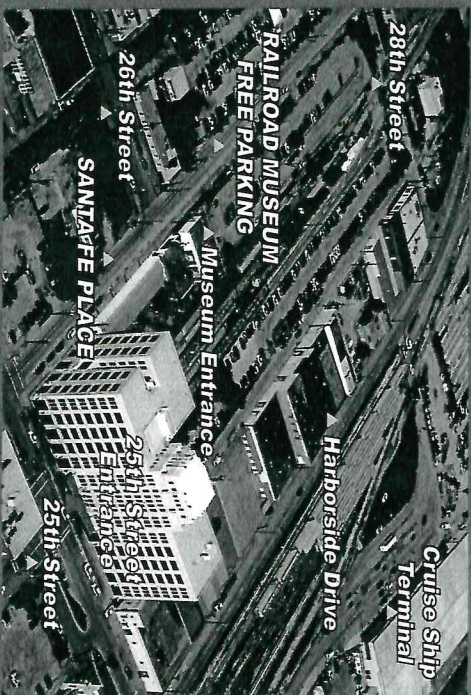
Take a trip back in time at the largest Railroad Museum in the Southwest. Enjoy a leisurely, self-guided tour through various rail cars from the late 19th and early 20th centuries. You'll see steam engines, passenger cars, mail cars and don't forget the caboose!

Inside the climate controlled, former Santa Fe Union Station and an adjacent museum building, you'll discover artifacts of the golden age of rail. Learn about the tools of the trade, view the opulent dining car wares in our exhibit "Restaurants on Rails" and view both of our operational scale-model railroad displays.

In the depot, you can imagine the conversations among the life-like "Ghosts of Travelers' Past" while they wait for their train.

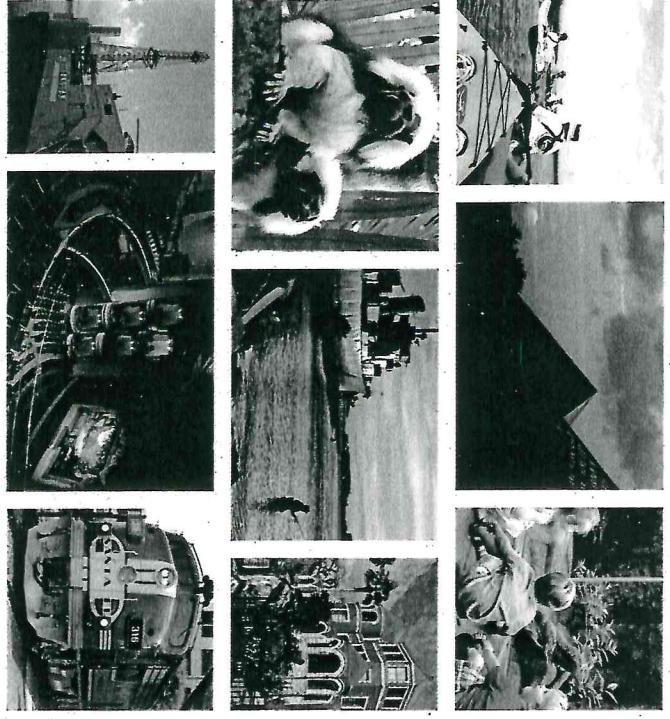

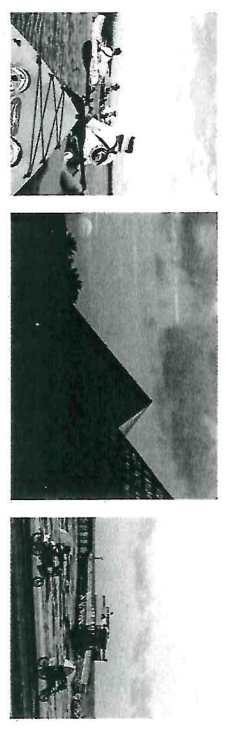

Between 1835 and 1935, more than 200,000 immigrants from all over the world entered the United States through Galveston, Texas. Their stories are as rich and diverse as their origins, and they gave the island a most unique cultural heritage which continues today. As the premier port of entry for the entire region, Galveston would rightfully come to be called America's Gateway on the Gulf.

THE GREAT STORM

No one will ever know how many lost their lives in Galveston's Great Storm of 1900. The best estimate is that at least 6,000 perished in the deadliest natural disaster in our history as a nation. A major center of commerce, with a population of 40,000, Galveston was the most important seaport in Texas and poised for greatness in the new century.

Then on September 8, 1900, came a hurricane of such fury it covered the island from Gulf to Bay and laid waste to the city by the sea.



THE PIRATE ISLAND OF JEAN LAFFITE

Pirate or patriot? Smuggler or businessman? Merciless murderer and thief, or hero in time of war? These are the contradictions of the legendary Jean Lafitte. His harsh actions have secured his place in infamy, but his motives remain a mystery to this day. Whatever the reasons, the mere mention of Lafitte in the early decades of the 1800s sent merchant ships throughout the Gulf of Mexico racing for safe harbor. As for the treasure he is said to have buried there, none has been found...yet.
